- Lee gave information on the POD plan updates. Newfound is nearly complete, Winnisquam will continue to move forward on this process. All POD plan updates are due to the state along with the revised regional plan.
- Rick spoke on the immunization work that is continuing on although Maren has left. Liz Lawrence will continue this program until it ends in June. We will wait to hear if there will be an immunization program next year.
- Rick mentioned that Jim will work as a trainer through a sub-contract with the Community Health Institute.
- Rick spoke of the class at the Manchester Public Health Department and congratulated Jim and Donna for completing this year long class.
- Jim reviewed the additional handouts in the packet.
- Chief Sullivan spoke of the upcoming NACA public safety day. This event will take place after the Memorial Day parade in Bristol on Monday, May 30<sup>th</sup>. There is no charge for this event and there will local, regional and state displays to view and visit.
